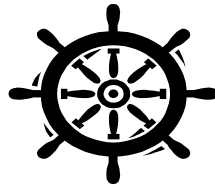

## Seasonal Friends

Hi Ladies & Ed,

Thanks to everyone for all the news this summer, I have really appreciated hearing from you through news letters etc. I thought I would let you know what has been going on in our lives summer.

This has not been a very good summer for me. I have not been able to get around to see friends, children, grandchildren as much as I hoped for while back in Michigan.

I had to have some female surgery middle of May, It took a bit longer then the 6 week recovery time.

Over the 4th of July, we were able to spend almost a week together with all our children and grandchildren at a campground in PA That was a wonderful family reunion as our middle child and his family that lives VA also joined us.

For the next 6 weeks John & I did some needed repairs on this old house. Stripping wall paper, painting, refinishing woodwork etc. Wow, did we work!! We had FL friends coming up for few days on Aug. 15th. I had a deadline no procrastinating allowed LOL. We kept working reminding ourselves that we would have the rest of Aug. and Sept to relax, visit & play.

Only a couple of hours after our good friends arrived, we were walking down Woodward at the Dream cruise viewing all those neat cars looking for my Brother Ron's Car Club. Apparently I was not watching where I was walking as I slipped off the edge of the side walk and fell. For the rest of the afternoon not thinking it was more than a twisted ankle, I sat with friends and family who kept icing my foot. I did not want to go to the hospital. I wanted everyone to just enjoy the day, I honestly was not in very much pain. Well that evening we decided to have x-rays just to make sure it was not a serious injury. I broke the right 5th metatarsal bone. One part of the bone twisted leaving a gap between. It is a no weight bearing injury. Doctor said sit with your leg elevated for the next three weeks then more x-rays. Well, I saw the doctor yesterday he said "no change it has not started to grow together". "Come back in another 3 weeks and we will take more x-rays and tell than if you need surgery." Well, needless to say I am down in the dumps. We tried to ask the doctor if after 3 weeks and no sign of healing that maybe with all my osteoporosis that I should just have the surgery now. Our question to him was if it hasn't even started to grow together by now will it even start by then? He shrugged his shoulders and said I guess we will just have to wait and see. {{easy for him to say }} Today I am going to call our HMO to see if I am allowed a second opinion under our insurance plan.

This will put our return to Fl off another couple of months if I need surgery.

After reading what I wrote: I realize this is only another little glitch in our lives. The Lord will see us through this in his time as he always has. As most of you know we are very thankful for each day, both of us being Cancer survivors.

Please keeps us in your prayers, {especially my husband} my caregiver, he has had a lot of extra work taking care of me.
